- 1. Converted in-library storage space to offices. Move some in-library storage to another campus building.
- 2. We are trying to more effectively manage the storage space we have, which will likely involve weeding our collection. Our collection is not large enough to warrant outside storage space.
- 3. We have limited storage space. We have looked into converting some of it but not seriously.
- 4. The Library houses lesser used resources in off site storage facilities and retrieves on demand. The Collections in the Libraries are capped or decreasing to allow for more student study spaces.

- 10. The Five Colleges of Ohio removed material from and closed our shared storage in 2012.
- 11. We have expanded storage space in our Technical Services area by added book shelves to house Archival Books and duplicates of local material.
- 12. We don't need storage.
- 13. We either need to weed or get outside storage space. Archives needs growth space and there is no space in the building.
- 14. We have a high density storage facility and plan on assessing the collection prior to requesting additional off-site storage.
- 15. We do not have a formal policy.
- 16. Items in storage are unavailable for use. They are in storage out of necessity, not choice. A building addition will take care of the need for off-site storage. In the meantime, digitizing collections helps make some of them useable.
