1. Book Store operated in a space within the library building. Annual Book Sale.
2. Casino was the most effective.
3. Library book sales.
4. Sale of donated books and magazines.
5. Library Lovers Calendar; Backstreet Books-used bookstore; Membership Drive; Jessie's Boutique (an annual women's gently used accessories sale); Jingle Books-Our end of year fundraiser for the next years book purchases-we kick this off on Give to the Max Day.
6. Bake sale, card sale, book shop.
7. Gala literary event.
8. Spring and Fall Book Sales, plus the 75th anniversary celebration for the library in the spring of 2012.
9. The most effective is c/o one group, which raises at least \$14,000 per year with a Holiday Craft Bazaar, going strong for over thirty years. Another Friends group has pretty good success with seasonal bake sales.
10. Annual Christmas Homes Tour; Annual Basket Raffle at Cabin Fever Reliever.

14. We have a community wide garage sale twice a year. A large book sale once a year. They also accept private donations on the library's behalf.

16. Christmas book basket silent auction; Book sale.
17. The Friends of the Library wrote a successful \$25,000 joint grant with the

Lower Colorado River Authority to fund a water- conserving fountain for the Library's Courtyard. They have an in-library store, Buy the Book, and sell donated/weeded books online as well.

18. Library has an in-house bookstore that raises over \$100 every month, we also host an annual vendor fair where the home-based party people buy a table for \$25 then also donate part of the days proceeds back to the Library Friends. We have also done book-sales. We host an annual Wine and Dine event and a holiday decor sale where people donate their gently used and unwanted holiday decorations to the library. We set this up the week before Thanksgiving and it runs through Christmas week. Some items are special priced but 90% are just a free-will offering. We always make over \$1000 on this event.

20. The Friends of the Arlington Public Library raise funds to support the Library through their biannual book sales. They also have biannual Book and Author Luncheons, which raise awareness of the Friends and the Library, but they are not money-makers.
